OUR VISION

We envision a world that embraces a healthy approach to sexuality, free from the harms of porn culture

THE FACTS

- · Mainstream porn is free, hardcore, and harming our youth
- Porn sites get more visitors each month than Netflix, Amazon, and Twitter combined, with Pornhub alone receiving 21.2 billion visits in 2015
- · Children first view pornography at the average age of 11 years old
- Increased availability through the internet has driven the demand for extreme content, resulting in free, mainstream pornography that is hardcore, degrading, and cruel
- Nearly 90% of the most-watched porn scenes contain physical, sexual, and/or verbal aggression against women
- Exposure puts some youth at risk of psychological trauma and pornography addiction, and health consequences such as sexual dysfunction, low self-esteem, depression, eating disorders, and substance abuse

WHAT'S THE SOLUTION?

Culture Reframed is committed to a whole and healthy approach to sexuality. Our goal is to promote a paradigm shift through which normative attitudes about pornography change. And our programs will equip parents and healthcare providers to build resilience and resistance in youth to the harms of pornography. We aim to help shift the culture from one that normalizes a pornographic, oppression-based sexuality to one that values and promotes a sexuality rooted in healthy intimacy, mutual care, and respect.

PARFNTS' PROGRAM

Parents feel increasingly overwhelmed by their children's consumption of hypersexualized and pornographic media, including violent and sexual video games, music videos, and social media. Parents often do not know that when their children access online pornography, they are exposed to brutal sexual violence. Our program will provide parents with tools to talk effectively with their families about hypersexualized media, pornography, and healthy sexuality, and to seek help if needed.

HEALTH PROFESSIONALS' PROGRAM

Healthcare certification programs have not yet approached pornography as a public health concern, leaving health professionals unprepared to deal with how pornography harms their clients or patients.

Our online education programs, conferences, and workshops—all with Continuing Education Units attached—will be the first to provide cutting-edge research, practical knowledge, and a standards-based skill set. Our goal is to enable practitioners and researchers to develop comprehensive knowledge of: pornography and its harmful effects; assessment for pornography in clinical disorders and forms of victimization; tailored treatment approaches for children, adolescents, individual adults, couples, and sexual offenders and batterers.
